OUR CLIMATE PLEDGE

Human-caused climate change is one of the biggest challenges of our generation. The scale of the change demands collective action.

In FY19, Logitech committed to the Paris Agreement to limit global warming to 1.5°C by 2050. We support international agreements and science-based approaches to support a 'net-zero' future, well before 2050 and global efforts to avoid further investment in fossil fuel expansion.





The 2022 report from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) makes it clear that we need to do more to reduce our carbon footprint and do it sooner. We proactively lobby and advocate for more progressive climate regulation to support this necessity.



We are formally committed to the Science-Based Targets initiative (SBTi) and our science-based carbon reduction targets have been validated by SBTi (SBTi Target Dashboard) as follows.

- 85% reduction of Scope 1 & 2 emissions by 2030, compared to a 2019 baseline
- 100% renewable electricity in our own operations, by 2030.
- >50% reduction in our Scope 3 emissions by 2030, compared to a 2021 baseline.
- >90% reduction of our Scope 1, 2 and 3 emissions by 2047, compared to a 2019 baseline, with 100% removal of any residual emissions to achieve net zero.

In addition to the above, we recognize the importance of an industry-wide shift to carbon transparency. We advocate for consumer and industry action to raise awareness around the importance of climate change and the carbon impact of products by bringing clarity to a product's carbon footprint. We are the first consumer electronics company to put carbon impact labels on our products, and we pledge to do this across our entire portfolio by end of 2025. Our goal is to empower consumers to make more informed purchasing decisions and to catalyze an industry-wide shift towards Carbon Clarity.
